Program Description:

YouthBuild is a 17-week training program where students will learn a wide range of skills from site inspection and controlled demolition to carpentry and painting.

You will work on:

- Construction and rehabilitation of Baltimore City homes
- Skills in site inspection, demolition, painting, and carpentry
- Giving presentations about what you've learned
- Community service projects

During this program, you will also get the following support:

- \$630 (before taxes) bi-weekly stipend
- \$1,718.25 education award upon program completion
- Job development opportunities
- Educational Support

- OSHA 10
- Sherwin Williams professional painting
- Home Builders Institute certifications
- Flagger Force Certification
- First Aid/CPR Certification

What do entry-level Construction Workers do?

Graduates of YouthBuild find employment in entry-level construction jobs. On the job, you will likely work on setting up and cleaning up job sites, helping skilled laborers on the job, working with tools of the trade, painting buildings and homes, remodeling, and demolition. Depending on the job, you will have other tasks as well.

Average starting wage:

\$13 per hour



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To be admitted to this program, you must:

- Take a math and reading test
- Complete an application
- Work with an intake specialist through Civic Works

Note: Nearly all jobs in construction will require you to pass a drug test before starting work. Many employers need their workers to move from job site to job site, and not all sites are in Baltimore City.
